

## Microsoft® Publisher 2000

**Postscripting**

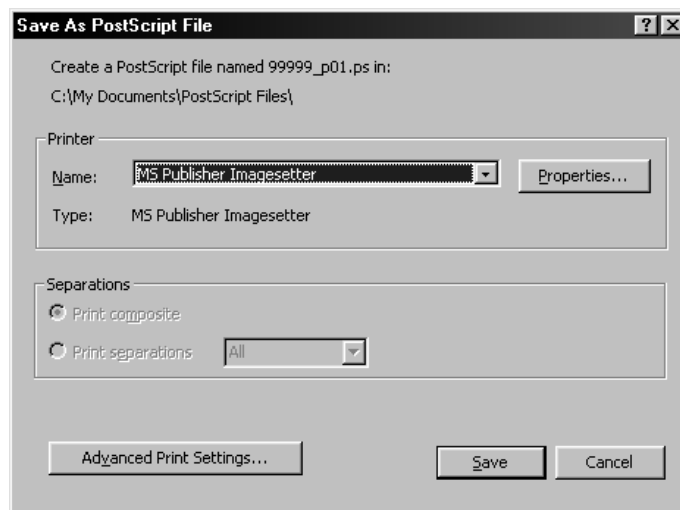
- In Publisher, you can print a publication as a process-color OR spot-color publication. Publisher does not support combining process color and spot color in the same publication.

- Publisher creates one multi-page PostScript for each document. There is no option to save single-page PostScript files.

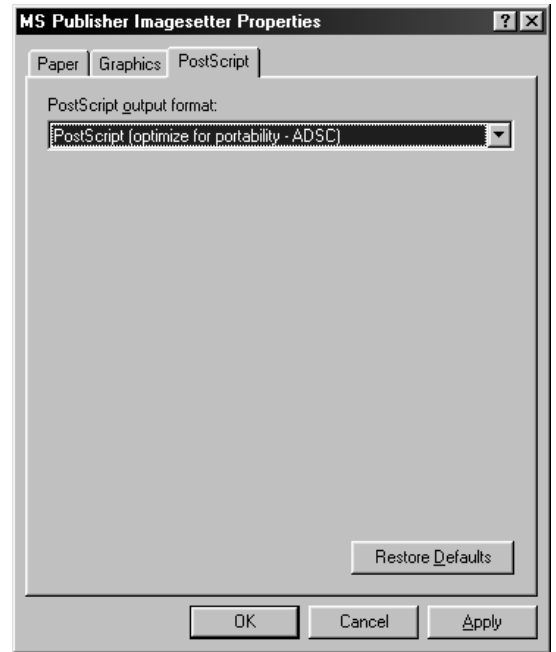
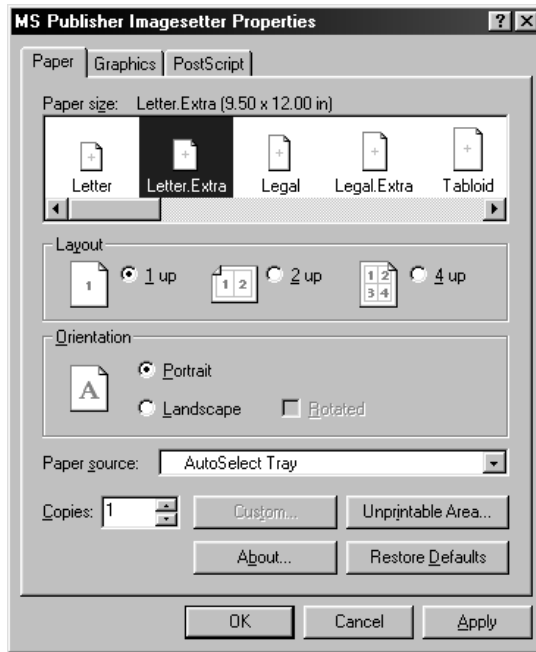
1. Install a PostScript printer driver and the appropriate PostScript printer description file.
2. Preflight the job and fix any problems.
3. Launch Publisher and open the publication you want to save as a PostScript file.
4. On the *File* menu, click *Save As*.
5. In the *File name* box, type a name for the file. You don't need to type a file name extension. Publisher automatically adds .ps to the end of the file name you type.
6. In the *Save as type* box, click *PostScript*. Click *Save*.



7. Publisher displays the *Save as PostScript File* dialog box. In the *Name* box, click the *MS Publisher Imagesetter*. (If you are given a choice, select *Print composite*.) Click on the *Properties* button.



8. While in the *Paper* tab, select *Letter.Extra*. Go to the *PostScript* tab and select *PostScript (optimize for portability - ADSC)*. Click *OK*.



11. From the *Save as PostScript File* window, click *OK*.  
12. Repeat these steps for additional Publisher documents.
