# Postscripting

**Before you start:**

Install the Prinergy Refiner.ppd and the Adobe PS 8.8 or later printer driver into the appropriate directories.

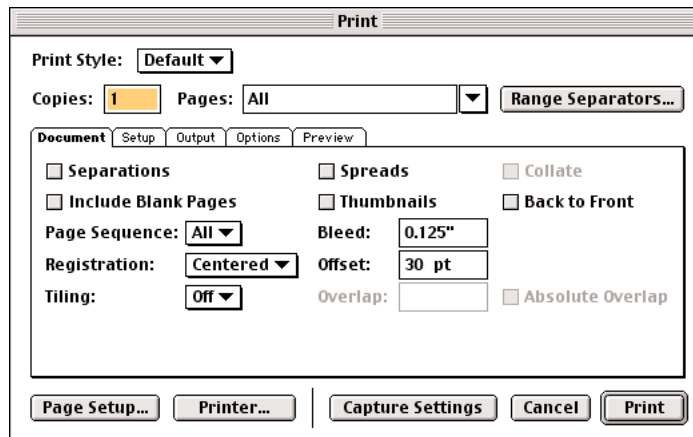
Install the Quark XPress Creo Color TIFF XT Quark XTension into the appropriate directory.

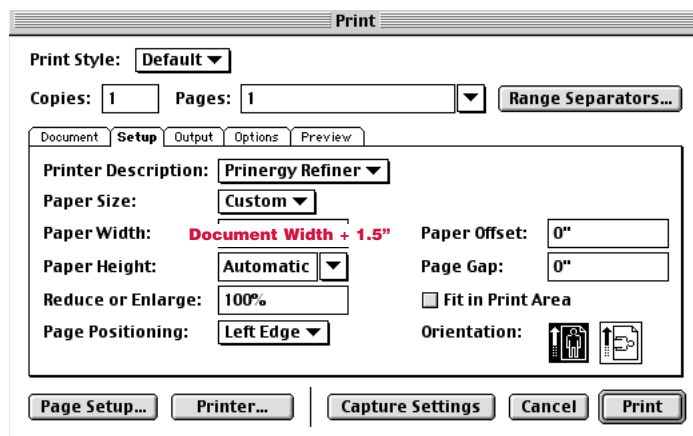
Preflight the job and fix any problems. [Flight Check](#), [Print Ready and Preflight Pro](#) are software applications used for preflighting, **OR** if you would rather outsource this function we recommend that you use [Magsend](#).

Place all page elements in the Quark XPress document. Pages must be complete.

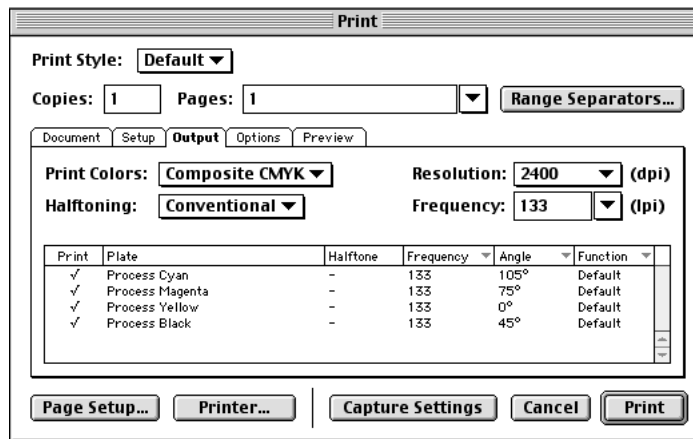
1. Before postscripting, go to *Chooser*, choose the *Adobe PS* driver and any PostScript printer.
2. Return to your Quark XPress document. Choose *Print* from the *File* menu. Edit to match the following screen capture.



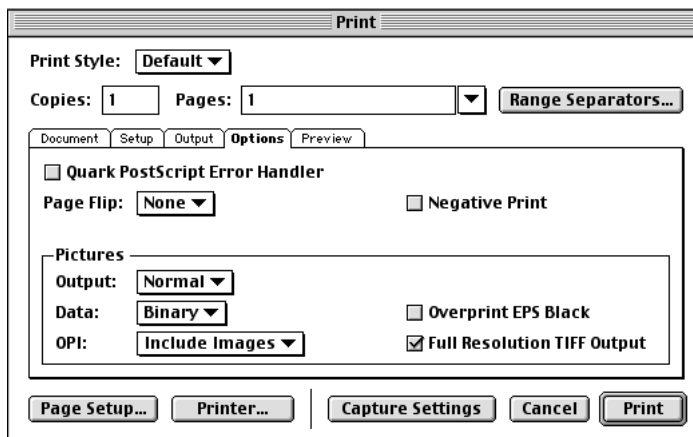
3. In the *Pages* range, enter the page to write to PostScript. **Each page must have its own PS file.**
4. Click the *Setup* tab and edit to match the following screen capture, except for the *Paper Width*. Set the *Paper Width* to 1.5" larger than actual document width.



- Click the *Output* tab and edit to match the following screen capture. **Please Note: With Composite CMYK chosen, Quark XPress does not list all of the colors actually being used or postscripted. Colors that are defined as spot will be postscripted as spot. All colors that are built in Quark XPress and any supporting applications, such as Adobe Illustrator, must be converted to the CMYK mode or model if they are suppose to be CMYK.**



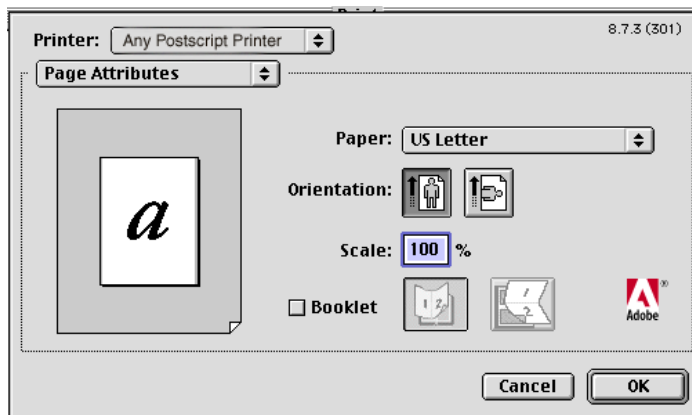
- Click the *Option* tab and edit to match the following screen capture.



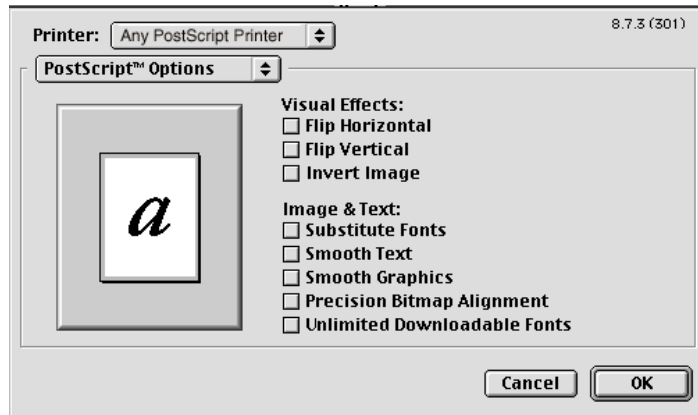
- Click the *Page Setup* button.



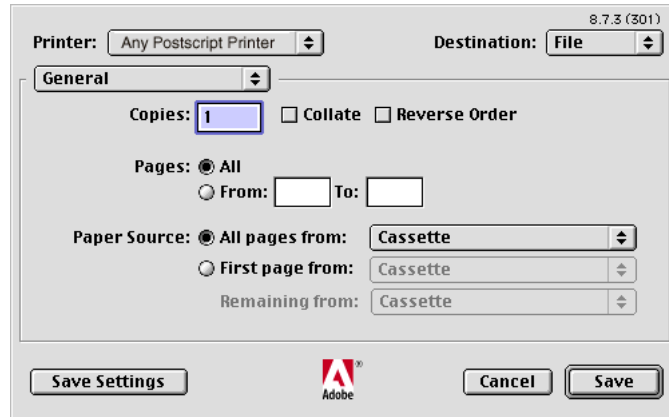
- Edit to match the following.



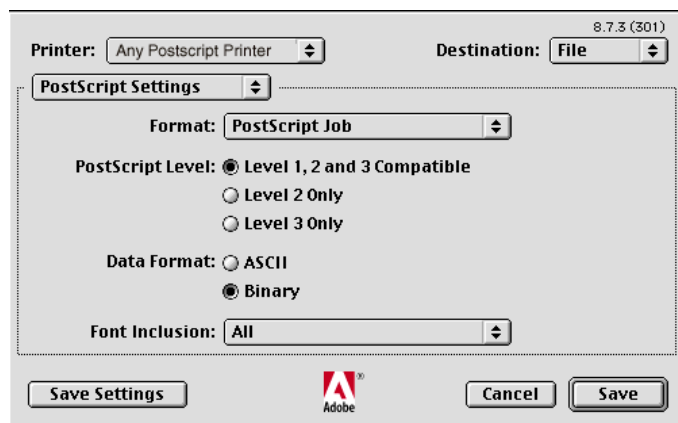
9. Click on the *Page Attributes* pop-up menu and select *PostScript Options*. Clear all selections. Click *OK*.



10. From the Print dialog box, click the *Printer* button (lower-left) and edit to match the following screen capture. **Do not enter a page range in this window.**



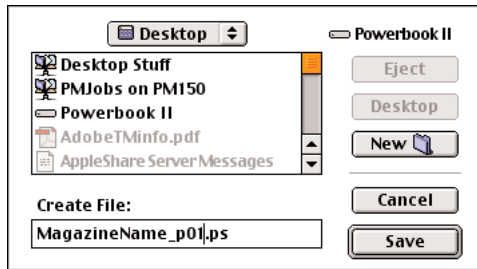
11. Click on the *General* pop-up menu and select *PostScript Settings*. Edit to match the screen capture.



- Click the *Save Settings* button to save the PostScript file settings. Click the *Save* button. Name each PostScript as follows: **MagazineName\_ClientName\_Month.ps**. **Please do not use special characters such as dashes (-), slashes (/), etc. in your file name. Use alphanumeric characters and underscores (\_) only.**

Note: This is the location and filename that will be used when you click *Print* in the last step.

- Click the *Save* button.
- Click the *Print* button (bottom-right) to save the PostScript file.
