

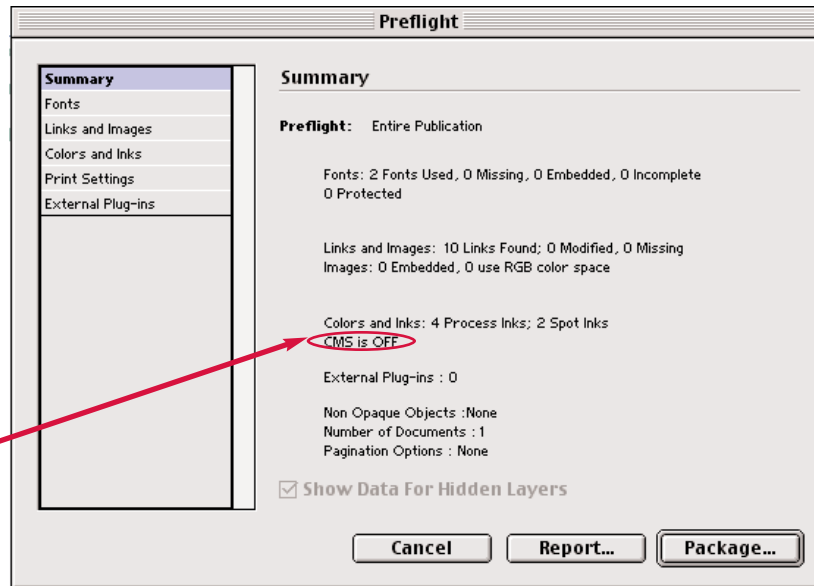
InDesign 2.0:

Creating PDF files without OPI

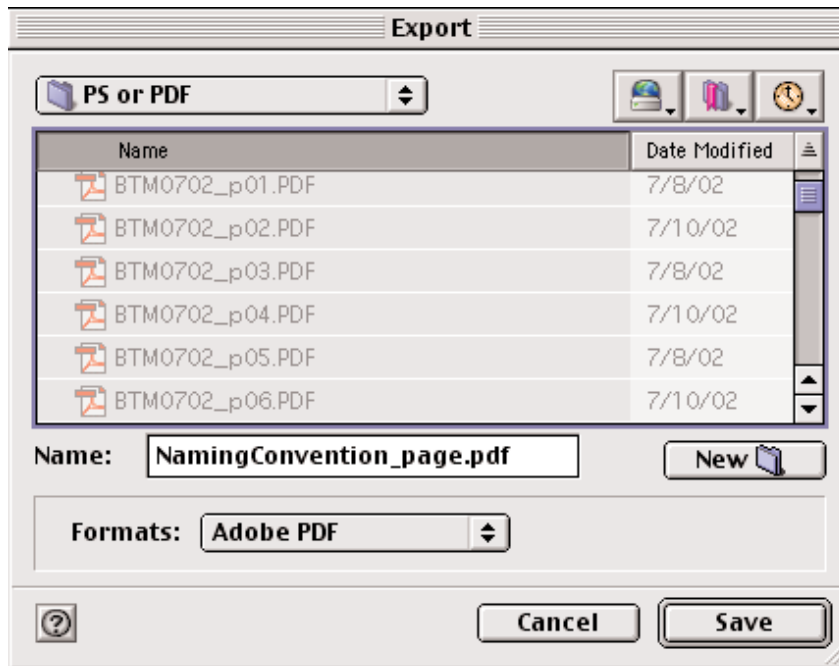
WARNINGS

Before creating a PDF file, make sure that all color management (CMS) has been turned off. Using a color management profile that is set up to make a proofer match a file may create unacceptable printed results after imaging the file for a digital workflow. Check your InDesign support documentation for more information on controlling CMS settings.

1. From your: *File menu>Preflight*, run a Preflight of your document. Correct all errors noted in Preflight Summary.



2. From the *File Menu>Export*, select *Adobe PDF* format. Save your final PDF pages with a standard naming convention and a page number.



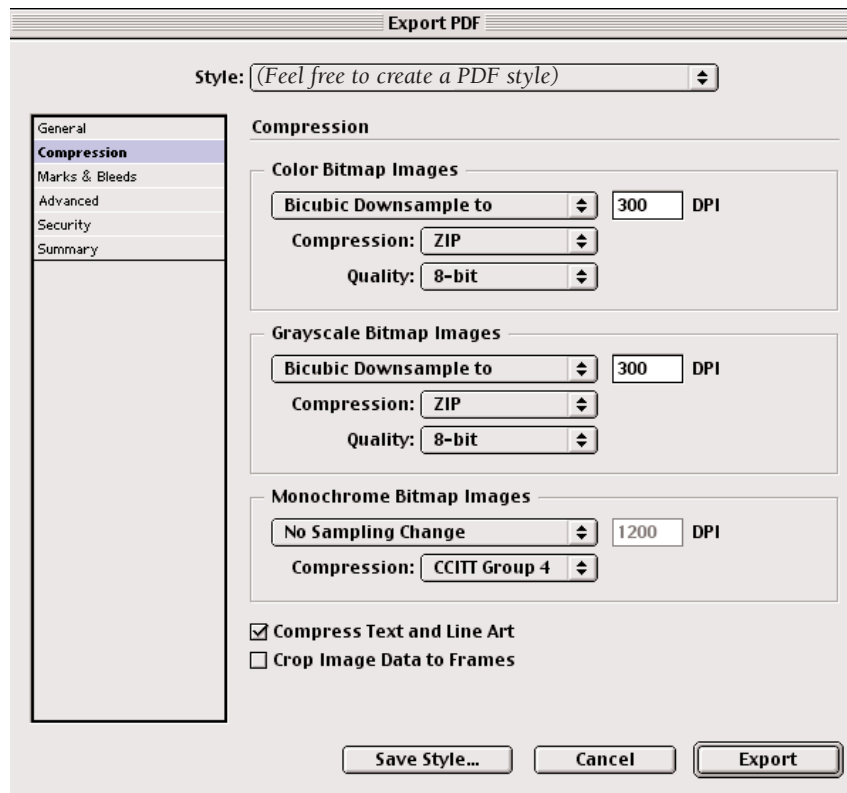
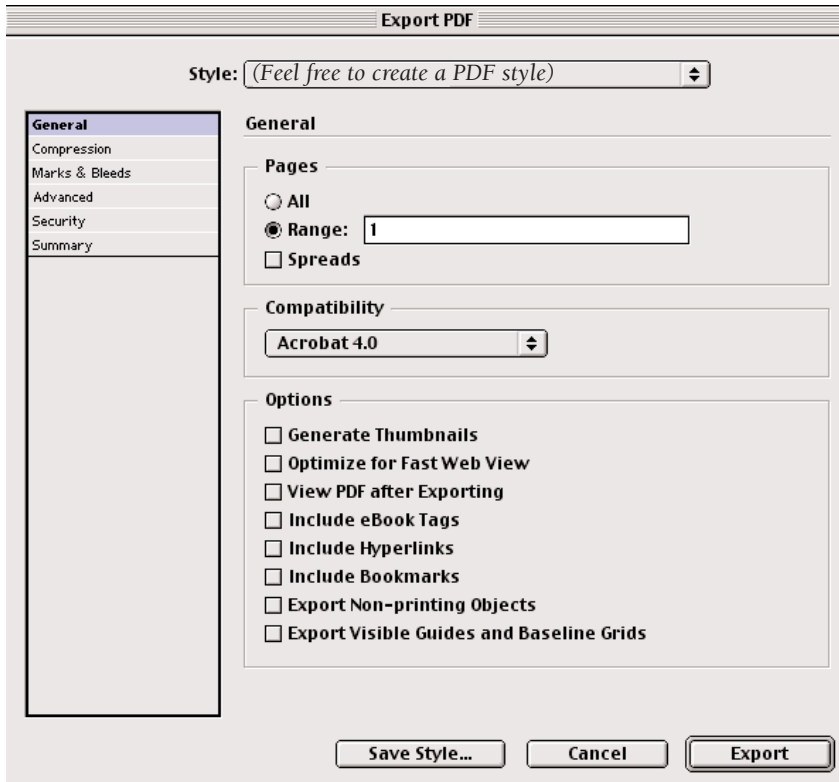
3. Select *Save*.

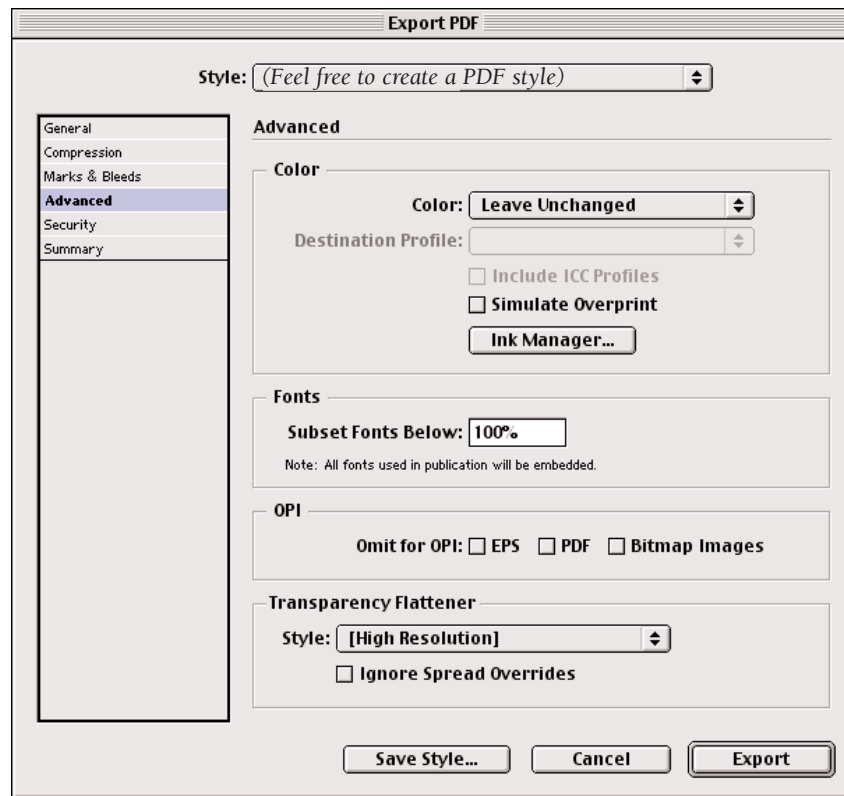
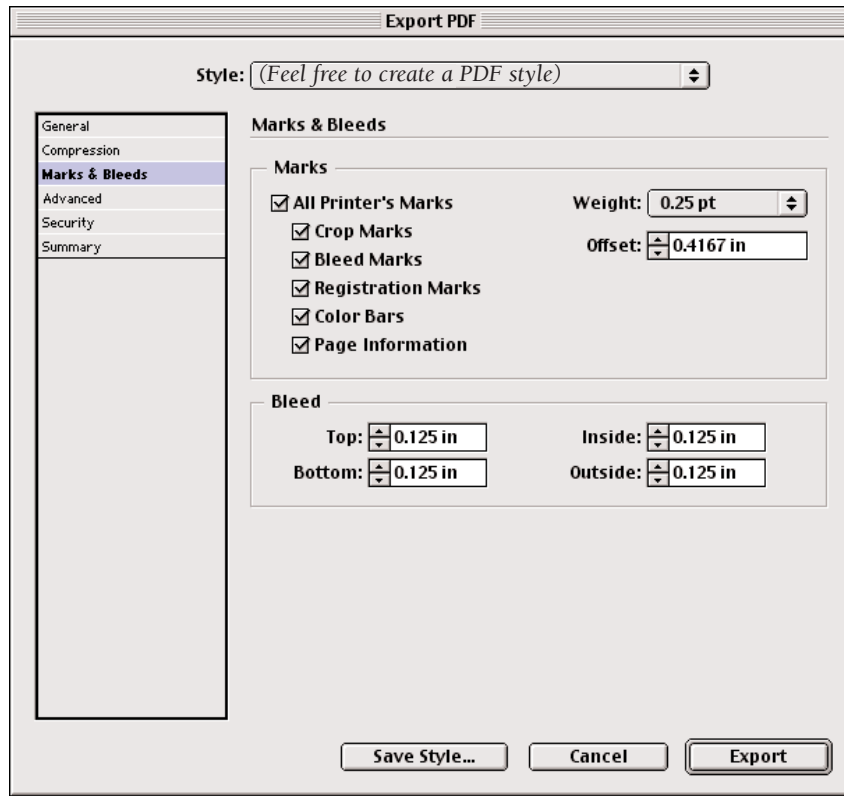

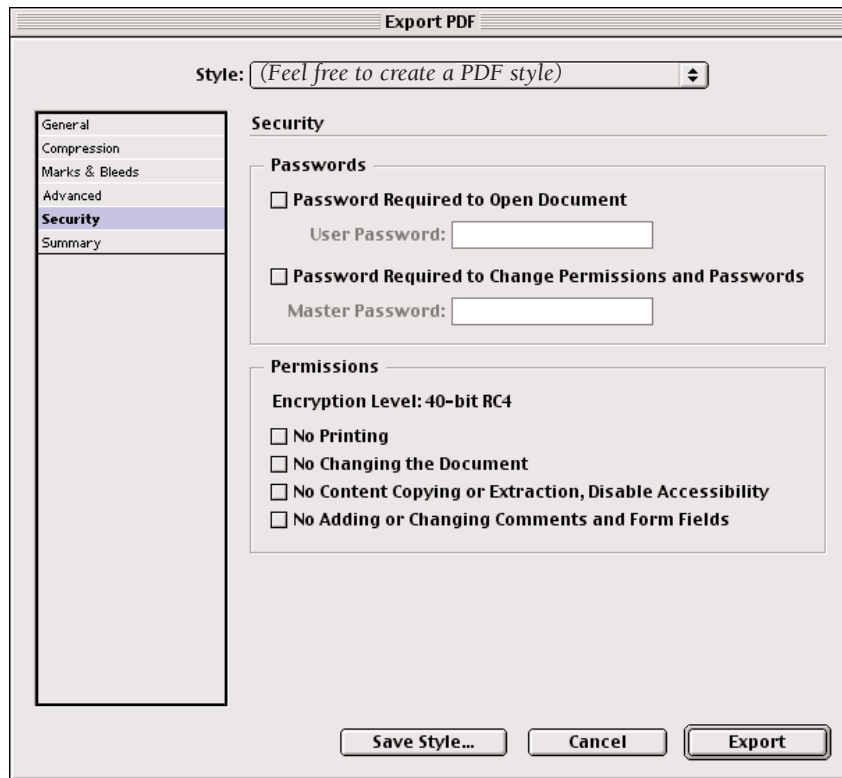
4. Edit your PDF Export option to match the following screen captures.
